










Notes from talk with Lauren:


- 6-top "swing" booths for flexibility at each end of roadway ("streeterie") dining
- All 2 or 4 tops except for at the ends
- Seating for those waiting for takeout
- All tables, chairs and plexiglass dividers should be moveable
- ADA accessibility by overlapping the curb and part of the subway grate
- Planters along curb to deflect subway noise
- 50% open walls along roadway to accommodate COVID-19 regulations
- Three different spaces:
 - o all open by entry
 - enclosed on two sides along storefront
 - 50% of walls open on roadway
- Festive lighting
- Mural art and graphics (inside and outside)- in-house and Amaya?
- Blanket rental or sale
- Creative heating (heated seats? Under table? Heated stones?)
- Flexible enclosure to open in summer; openable plexiglass?
- Menu changes (soups and hot drinks)
- Using sides and roofs for signage and art

Amaya

Tables very close together

Narrow walkway for pedestrians

Mailbox provides barrier for one table

Gap between roof and walls for airflow Removable plastic around structure (good for when the seasons change)

Electric (?) heaters at the bottom of the structure



This particular structure has a clear roof which acts as the light source as well as the heating source. There's also a downward slant so rain and snow can fall of the side. - Veer

























Planters-


- A mix of tall and short plants

 - Shorter ones in between tables and sidewalk (subway noise, etc)









Heating - Steel structure with steel louvers






Heating - Steel rail structure with hanging fabric or polygal plastic panels








Heating - Wood structure with hanging fabric or polygal plastic panels








Seating Ideas

- No more than 6 chairs per table (avoids overcrowding area)
- Varying seating options
 - Single chairs/stools, benches, booths
 - Boothes: great barrier, not so movable, pretty comfortable
 - Chairs: moveable, not great barrier, prob most comfortable
 - Benches: moveable, versatile, not comfortable
- Possible heat/seat combo
 - Heaters on booths
- *all seating will have some type of barrier
 - Hanging, stationary(floor), etc.




Dividers


- Hanging dividers

 - o ie: booth, planter, etc.
















Interview with Lauren Lynch at Harlem Public and At The Wallace




